Folded Coasters And Hot Pads

For 4 coasters, cut:

6 ea. 5" squares of 4 different fabrics Total 24 ea. 5" squares

4 ea. 5" squares of lightweight cotton batting (Like Warm and Natural)


Assembly:

To make one coaster:

- 1. Select 3 squares of one fabric and then add a square of each remaining fabric... (6 squares total) and a single batting square.
- 2. Sandwich a batting between 2 squares of the same fabric.
- 3. You should have 4 squares of different fabrics left. Fold each of these in half, either diagonally or like a Hot Dog bun. Place one atop the batting sandwich, matching raw edges and with fold across center as shown.
- 4. Working clockwise, place a second square at across the square, again aligning raw edges.
- 5. Add a third square still working clockwise.
- 6. Before adding the last square, fold up half of the first square to expose the base of the coaster so the coaster will appear woven.
- 7. Relay first folded square.
- 8. Pin the folded squares in place. Stitch around outer edge with 1/4 inch seam. Trim the corners.
- 9. Pull gentle at the center of the folded squares to turn right side out. Press.
- 10. Repeat this process to make 3 more coasters.

For an 8 1/2" trivet/hot pad, cut:

3 ea 9" squares of 1 fabric and 3 more 9" squares each of different fabrics.

1 (or 2) 9" square(s) of cotton batting.

Follow the steps above to make a large coaster, oops, a trivet/hot pad!

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
