

Lasagna Quilt

Finished Size: Approx. 42" X 54"

You will need:

1/3 yd (12") of THIRTEEN different fabrics.

Now, we need "width of fabric" strips so only full-width scraps. (Well, I guess you could piece some strips)

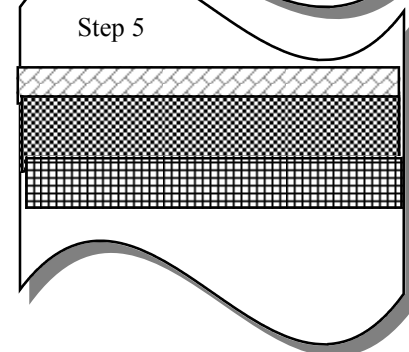
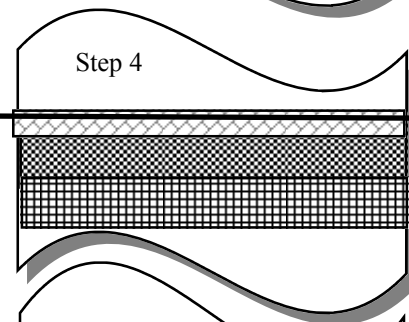
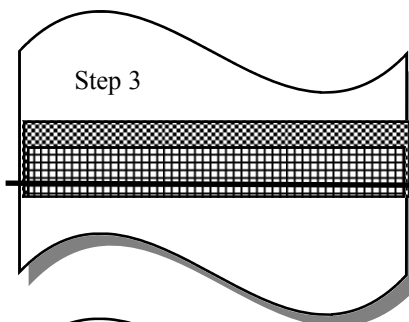
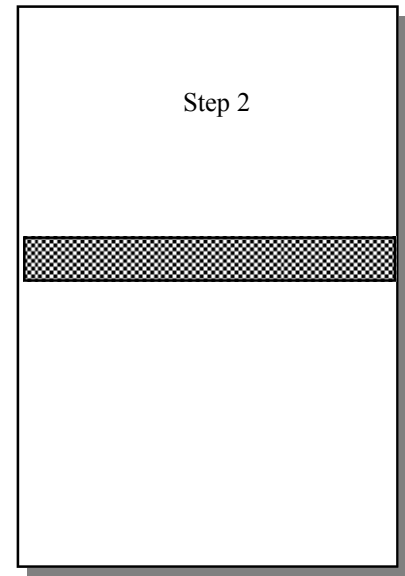
1/2 yd of one fabric for binding. You will also need 1 1/2 yards of backing fabric and a 45" x 60" piece of cotton batting.

Cutting:

Cut each of your 1/4 yard (or longer) lengths into Width of Fabric strips ranging from 1 1/2" to 2 3/4". I generally cut into 4" strips then sub cut one of these into 2 ea. 2" strips and the other one into either 1 1/2" and 2 1/2" strips or 1 3/4" and 2 1/4" strips. The idea is you want lots of narrow strips.

Assembly:

1. Baste your back and batting together either using spray adhesive or safety pins. If you use pins, you MUST remove them as you stitch your strips to the back/batting assembly.
2. Choose a strip at random (I literally put my strips in a bag!) and lay it right side up on your back/batting assembly.
3. Choose another strip. Lay it atop your first strip, right sides together, aligning the top edges. Pin if necessary. Stitch through all layers with a 1/4" seam. Fold out and finger press.
4. Choose another strip. Lay it atop your first strip, right sides together, now aligning the bottom edges. Pin if necessary. Stitch through all layers with a 1/4" seam. Fold out and take to the iron and really press both seams. We don't want ANY puckers, so press.
5. Choose another strip. Lay it atop your step 3 strip, right sides together, aligning the top edges. Pin if necessary. Stitch through all layers with a 1/4" seam. Fold out and finger press.
6. Choose another strip. Lay it atop your Step 4 strip, right sides together, aligning the bottom edges. Pin if necessary. Stitch through all layers with a 1/4" seam. Fold out and press this seam and the last.
7. Repeat steps 5 and 6, working toward the top and toward the bottom of your quilt until the entire baking/batting assembly is covered.
8. Trim edges and bind! Add appliqué if desired.
