Ventura 100 Doll Quilt Pattern (18" x 24")

This would be a great "First Quilt" to make with a child.

Easy cutting and easy piecing!

No Seams To Match!

Supplies: Enough scraps for...

Cutting: 100 ea. 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles (Or if a larger quilt is desired cut more rectangles and adjust pattern. OR cut 100 rectangles to be 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" for a quilt sized 24" x 32". Binding: 2 ea. 2" x Width of Fabric strips. Backing and batting for your size quilt.





Make 4 Rows of 12


Make 4 Rows of 13



Stitch together, centered, then trim

Assembly:

- 1. Set aside 4 Rectangles.
- Stitch remaining rectangle into 48 pairs, then stitch the pairs into 24 sets of 4.
- 2. Now use those sets of 4 to make 8 rows of 12 rectangles.
- 3. Choose 4 rows. Add one of the reserved rectangles to each of those rows.
- 4. Now stitch a row of twelve, centered, to a row of 13. Make 4. Trim the bit that hangs over (about 3/4".)
- 5. Stitch the step 4 units together so the rows of 12 alternate with the rows of 13.
- 6. Layer. Quilt or tie as desired. Bind with 2" WoF strips.



Here is another option:
Cut 48 Light rectangles,
8 Purple, 8 Light Blue, 8
Gold, 8 Teal, 8 Pink, and
8 Green rectangles.
This is put together alternating Colors and the
Light and with careful
placement of the colors,
you get the rainbow effect. Note this one requires the seams to
match!
