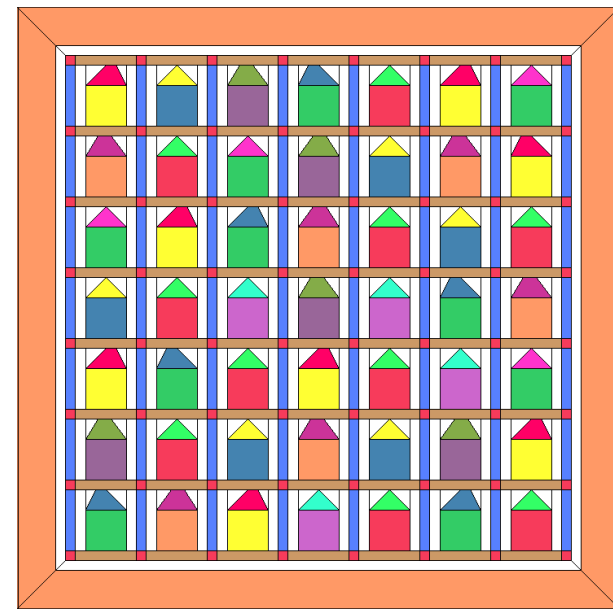
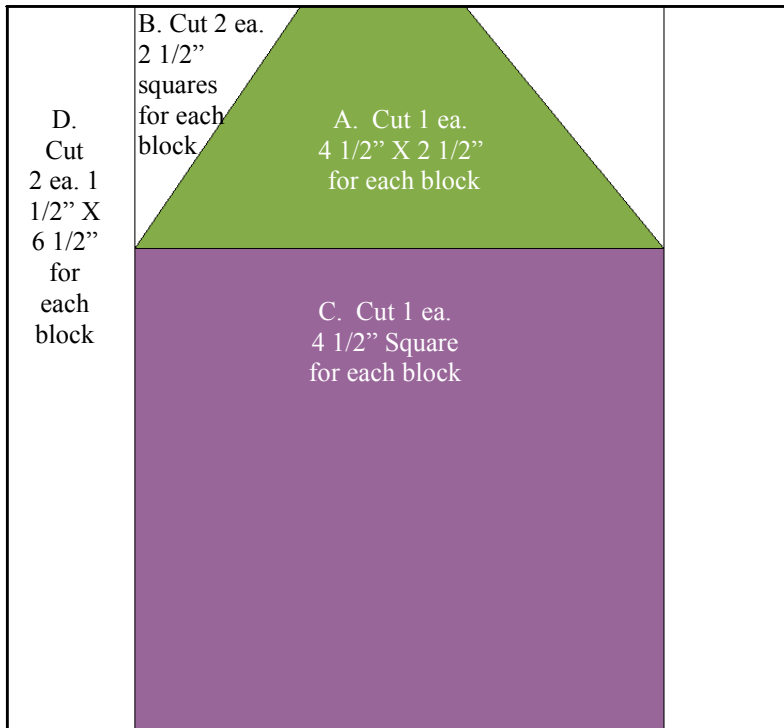


# Moondoggie's (60" Square)

Based on a swap of at least 74 ea. 5" Squares

Block is 6" Finished

*Remember Moondoggie from the old Gidget movies? There was always an old shack barely standing on the beach. It always evoked a fun image of staying on the sand all the time! Recreate that feeling with these wonky roofed huts!*



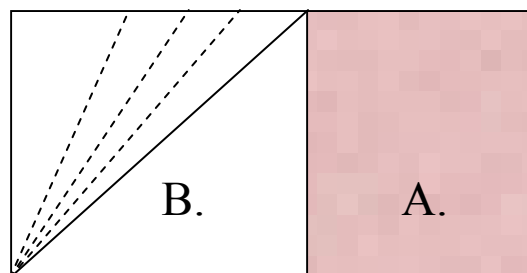
49 ea. 6 1/2" Unfinished Blocks

Cut 49 ea. 5" Squares to 4 1/2" Square.

Cut 25 ea. into 2 ea. 4 1/2" X 2 1/2"

Also 2 Yards Background cut as at left. Inside border cut 1 1/2" 2 Yards for Border and Binding

The block is easy to assemble as shown. The trick is to start with the A and B pieces. You are going to snowball the Bs onto the A, but in an irregular fashion to make the roofs appear wonky on the hut.



Normally you would sew on the solid line to make a snowball. To get a little wonky, stitch in the fashion of one of the dashed lines. Note that they are all on the outside of the solid line and start at the lower corner of the square, this is what makes it work. After stitching, fold back and press. Then turn over and trim away excess. Repeat for other edge of rectangle. Now you have a wonky roof.

Continue with the block as above, adding the large square, then the two sides to complete. The quilt is sashed with Sandy Brown horizontals, Blue Sky verticals (1/2 yard ea. then cut 56 ea. 1 1/2" X 6 1/2") and Red (1/4 yard then cut 64 ea. 1 1/2" squares) cornerstones.
