Supplies for Blocks:

Dark Color A:

1/2 yard

Light Color A: 1/2 yard Dark Color B: 1/2 yard

Light Color B: 1/2 yard


Leaf Green: 1 1/2 yards

White on White: 3 yards

HeatNBond Lite: 2 1/2 yards.



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Add 2" Extension to Foliage Template Bottom When Fusing

Cutting:

White on White: 18 ea. 12" X 17" Blocks for Backgrounds.

Prep for applique your favorite way:

18 sets of the leaf/stems

Note: Add 2" extension to Foliage Template bottom (As Shown At

Right) when tracing onto HeatNBondLite...before fusing!

Also Window Pane (Trim away the center) each piece before fusing.

Applique 2 Color Sets of 9 irises (18 total)

We Will Swap These Blocks In Class In Fall 2012

If you are not a class member but wish to make these blocks, you can:

Dig in your stash for fabrics to make your blocks Organize a block swap of your own Or Grab some fat quarters and start stitching!

Block Assembly:

Make each iris in Two Shades of one color... A Darker Shade on the bottom petals of the flower and A Lighter Shade on the top petals). Use one color family for each flower. Nine blocks in one color... Purple, pink, yellow, blue or... And nine Blocks in another color. Add a nice leaf green for the foliage. Use Tone on Tone fabrics. Make the tall leaf all in one and lay under your Iris petal.

Stitch using matching sulky rayon thread with about a 2.00 width zigzag and about a 1.00 stitch length.

We will add the Rectangular Snowballed Corners later when the setting info is given after we swap in class in the Fall.

Sign Your Name with a Pigma permanent marker as indicated along side the stem.
