## Wind Blown Geese ( 27 " $\times 31$ ")

6" blocks. Each with three 2" x 4" Geese. Use 4 At Once Method (Next Page) to make 36 ea. $2^{\prime \prime}$ x 4" Flying Geese Blocks using:

| 4 ea. | $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip |
| 2 ea. | $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 221 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip |

Border (One of the Geese?):

| 2 ea. | $3^{\prime \prime} \times 261 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |
| :--- | :--- |
| 2 ea. | $3^{\prime \prime} \times 271 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ |

Binding (Another Geese?):
3 ea. $\quad 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ width of fabric

## Assembly:

1. Stitch a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Square to the left side of 12 of the Geese blocks.
2. Stitch a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Square to the right side of 12 of the remaining Geese blocks.
3. To the final 12 Geese blocks add a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to both sides.
4. Following Diagram A at right, assemble 6 A Blocks.
5. Following Diagram B at right, assemble 6 B Blocks.
6. "Stack" the blocks as at right, alternating ABAB. Make 3 stacks.
7. Stitch a $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the left side of each stack. Set the stacks together and add another $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ $241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the right side as shown.
8. Add $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 221 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the top and bottom to complete the Quilt center.

9. Add the final borders using the

2 ea. $3^{\prime \prime} \times 261 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ on the sides and the
2 ea. 3" x $271 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip at top and bottom. 10. Quilt as desired.
11. Bind with $2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

## LynBrown.com Presents Spiffy 4 At Once Method for Flying Geese

You need two fabrics, a Goose fabric (single big triangle) and a Sky fabric (pair of smaller triangles). A Flying Geese Unit is twice as wide as it is long. For this method, you cut Sky squares 7/8" larger than the finished Flying Geese unit is long (4 ea. For 4 geese) and Goose squares $1 \mathbf{1 / 4 "}$ larger than the finished width (only 1 ea. for 4 geese).
Example: For geese that finish 2" X 4", cut 4 ea. Sky square 2
 $7 / 8$ " and one goose fabric square $51 / 4$ ".

## To make 4 Geese:

1.Finger press or draw one diagonal crease in each of your smaller (Sky) squares.
2.Lay two smaller (Sky) squares right sides together (RST) to the larger square so the smaller squares align with opposite corners
 of the larger (Goose) square as at right. Be sure diagonal creases line up as shown.
3.Stitch $1 / 4$ " on both sides of those creases. Cut on the diagonal. Now you have two odd looking sections (shown). Press to the Sky Triangles.
4. On each section, lay another Sky square RST in

 the corner of each Goose as shown.
5.Stitch on both sides of marked diagonal. Cut on the diagonal.
6. Press to the Sky triangles and you have four Flying Geese units. Trim if necessary.
