

INCHIE BRACELET

These tiny quilts are sweeping the quilt world.
Make yours into a fun bracelet!

SUPPLIES:

Various scraps about 3" square.

Scrap of batting (3" X13"), scrap for backing (Make it Reversible!)

Sew-on Magnetic closure (mine is from Ghee's)

E6000 glue or similar

BRACELET ASSEMBLY:

1. Piece together some scraps. The sample was made from Bali pop left-overs, the pieces were 2 1/2" wide. I just pieced them together into a strip about 12" long by 2 1/2". This is enough for 2 (and possibly 3!) bracelets.

2. Layer the pieced strips with backing and batting. Pin or baste.

3. Quilt the strip a bit.

4. Add some selvedge pieces (or other embellishments) crisscrossing quilted strip. Add some other smaller fabric pieces to contrast. Quilt these pieces atop strip.

5. Cut the quilted strip into 2 each 1" X 12" strips.

6. Finishing the edges... Build a zigzag edge: Run a mid width, mid length zigzag along the long edges of these narrow strips. Next run a shorter, wider over the first zigzag.

7. Cut the strips into 1" square pieces. Chain zigzag along the unfinished edges the same way as above with contrasting thread if desired, but chaining from one piece to the next to form the bracelet. Chain eight pieces together (I needed 8, you might need 7 or 9. Be sure to overlap by one square for closure), first along one side, then the other. Repeat for strength.. Add any other embellishments... Charms, beads, hot fix crystals, etc.

8. Glue the magnetic closure pieces in place (I know they are Sew-On but it's much easier to glue them!)... One on one end on the outside, one on the other end on the wrong side following glue manufacturer's instructions. (NOTE: Bracelet is reversible.)

9. Wear and enjoy!



Piece together scraps,
Layer and quilt



Add some selvages or
other embellishments and

Cut strips 1" wide and
build a tight zigzag
along the edge



Cut strips into squares...



Chain 8 squares together
with a zigzag. Repeat.



Glue the magnetic closure pieces in place... One on
one end on the outside, one on the other end on the
wrong side following manufacturers instructions.

This End Square is
folded back to
show the glued
closure.
