
Burgoyne Surrounded Week 7 Use Chain and Background ONLY

you are ready to put your Burgoyne Surrounded Quilt together.




(Sashing Row+Block Row for large quilt) +Bottom Sashing Row




Burgoyne Surrounded History

During the American Revolution, the Colonial forces met the British in battle at Saratoga. The British general was "Gentleman Johnny" Burgoyne and his 7000 men far outnumbered the Americans. However, the colonists prevailed, and this pattern illustrates that battle, with Burgoyne's large force in the center of the block and the smaller groups of Americans surrounding them. The battle was a turning point in the War for Independence. In the spirit of all those soldiers so long ago, you have met the challenge of the unknown and won the battle of the Marathon Mystery!
