Two Different Lights:
2 each 7" squares of each (4 squares total)

## Prep for Applique

 Your Favorite Way:As desired, see color hints in the flag patterns.
Assembly:

1. Stitch the four 7 " light squares into a 4-Patch with fabric alternating for the background square.
2. Arrange flags atop Applique Pressing Sheet or Parchment Paper.
3. Applique flags, centered on block.
4. Trim appliquéd block to 12 $1 / 2$ " OR reserve to be trimmed to Tumbler Shape* later.

Colors: If your quilt is monochromatic, use value to denote the colors in the flag. Use your darkest where the black is, medium dark for the blue, light dark for the red. Use a medium for the yellow and a light in place of the white.


## U.S. Navy Signal Flags

Even in these days of and satellite communications, the U.S. Navy still uses the international alphabet flags, numeral pennants, numeral flags, and special flags and pennants for visual signaling. These signal flags are used to communicate while maintaining radio silence.
Navy Signalmen transmit messages by hoisting a flag or a series of flags on a halyard. Each side of the ship has halyards and a "flag bag", containing a full set of signal flags. Signals unique to the Navy are used when communicating with other U.S. Navy or allied forces.
