
Block Finishes at 8"... That's 8 1/2" Raw.






Cutting:

8		
Background:	2 ea.	2 7/8" Squares
Green:	2 ea.	2 7/8" Squares: Cut on One Diagonal Only
White:	1 ea.	3 1/4" Square: Cut on Both Diagonals
Red:	1 ea.	2 1/2" Square
	2 ea.	2 7/8" Squares
	1 ea.	5 1/4" Square: Cut on Both Diagonals
Gold:	4 ea.	2 7/8" Squares

Block Assembly:

- 1. Add a White Triangle to opposite sides of the 2 1/2" Red Square, centered. Repeat with remaining White Triangles for the last two sides o the Red Square to make a Square in A Square.
- 2. Add Green Triangles to the Step One Unit, in a similar manner. Trim 4 1/2", keeping points true.
- 3. Make 4 Flying Geese Units following instructions on next page with the Red 5 1/4" Square (Geese) and Gold 2 7/8" Squares (Sky). Completed Geese units should measure 2 1/2" X 4 1/2"
- 4. Mark one diagonal on the Background Squares. Layer a Background Square RST with a Red 2 7/8" square. Stitch on both sides of the marked diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Open and trim to $2 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 4.
- 5. Add Flying Geese units to opposite sides of the Square In A Square Step 2 units. (Center Row)
- 6. Watching orientation, add Half Square Step 4 units to opposite sides of remaining Flying Geese units. Make two. (Top and Bottom Rows)
- 7. Stitch rows together to complete the block, watching orientation. Block should measure 8 1/2" raw/unfinished.



LynBrown.com Presents Spiffy 4 At Once Method for Flying Geese

You need two fabrics, a Goose fabric (single big triangle) and a Sky fabric (pair of smaller triangles). A Flying Geese Unit is twice as wide as it is long. For this method, you cut Sky squares 7/8" larger than the finished Flying Geese unit is long (4 ea. For 4 geese) and Goose squares 1 1/4" larger than the finished width (only 1 ea. for 4 geese).

Example: For Geese blocks that finish 2" X 4", cut 4 ea. Sky squares 2 7/8" and one Goose fabric square 5 1/4".

To make 4 Geese:

- 1.Finger press or draw one diagonal crease in each of your smaller (Sky) squares.
- 2.Lay two smaller (Sky) squares right sides together (RST) to the larger square so the smaller squares align with opposite corners of the larger (Goose) square as at right. Be sure diagonal creases line up as shown.
- 3. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of those creases. Cut on the diagonal. Now you have two odd looking sections (shown). Press to the Sky Triangles.
- 4. On each section, lay another Sky square RST in the corner of each Goose as shown.
- 5. Stitch on both sides of marked diagonal. Cut on the diagonal.
- 6. Press to the Sky triangles and you have four Flying Geese units. Trim if necessary.
