2014 Block Of The Week From LynBrown.com Block Number Two – Quintuplets



Cutting:

Green:	2 ea.	2 7/8" Squares
White:	2 ea.	2 7/8" Squares
Red:	3 ea.	2 7/8" Squares
Gold:	3 ea.	2 7/8" Squares
Background:	6 ea.	2 7/8" Squares

Block Assembly:

- 1. Draw/Press one diagonal line on the wrong side of all background and white squares.
- 2. Pair a White square with a Green square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of White and Green squares to make a total 4 Half Square Triangles. Press. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 3. Next pair a Red square with a Background square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of Red and Background squares to make a total of 6 Half Square Triangles. Press. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 4. Make a Pinwheel, as at right, using three Red/Background Half Square Triangles and one Green/White Half Square Triangle. Make two of these pinwheels. Trim to 4 1/2".
- 5. Now pair a Gold square with a Background square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of Gold and Background squares to make a total of 6 Half Square Triangles. Press. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 6. Make a Pinwheel, as at right, using three Gold/Background Half Square Triangles and one Green/White Half Square Triangle. Make two of these pinwheels. Trim to 4 1/2".
- 7. Following the block diagram below, assemble the four Pinwheels so a Green/White Pinwheel appears in the center, always watching orientation. Block should measure 8 1/2".










Block Assembly:

- 1. Draw/Press one diagonal guide along the wrong side of the Background, G White and Red 2 7/8" squares. Place a Background square Right Sides Together (RST) with a Green Square and stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut and square to 2 1/2". Repeat for other Background and Green Square. Also pair a Red with a Green 2 7/8" square and repeat AND a White with Green and repeat. You should have four Background and Green, two Green and Red and two Green and White Half Squares.
- 2. Stitch two Green and Red and two Green and White Half Square units to make the center block motif. Should measure 4 1/2".
- 3. Cut the Background 3 1/4" squares on both diagonals to get 8 small triangles. Following diagram at right, add a Background small triangle (short side) to a Red square, aligning the straight edges. In a similar way, add a Background triangle to adjacent side of Red square as shown. Make 4 units.
- 4. Cut the Gold 2 7/8" squares on one diagonal to get 8 triangles. Following diagram, add the long side of the gold squares to the short sides of the step 3 units. Make 4.
- 5. Watching orientation, add a step 4 unit to two opposite sides of the step 2 unit.
- 6. Add Background/Green Half Squares from step 1 to both short sides of the remaining step 4 units, as shown watching the orientation of the step 4 unit.
- 7. Following diagram, add step 6 units to top and bottom of the step 5 unit to complete the block.



Reverse Applique:

I used a little reverse appliqué on this one. I prepared the fused snowflake from White using the pattern given. Then I cut a Gold 4" circle and a Green 1" circle (Dashed Lines)both without fusible. I centered the Green on the Gold circle centered atop the background square. Then I fused the Snowflake centered on top of it all. The fusing catches all of it! Then stitched as usual. © 2013 Lyn Brown LynBrown.com 2/20/14

Note the block on the left is turned to have snowflake points on NESW. The block on the right has the points as in the pattern lay out. Choose which you like best.

Block Assembly:

- 1. Draw/Press one diagonal line on the wrong side of all background and white squares.
- 2. Pair a Red square with a White square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of Red and White squares to make a total of 4 Half Square Triangles. Press to Red. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 3. Pair a Background square with a Green square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of Background and Green squares to make a total 4 Half Square Triangles. Press to Green. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 4. Next pair a Gold square with a Background square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of Gold and Background squares to make a total of 4 Half Square Triangles. Press. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 5. Next pair a Red square with a Background square RST. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Repeat for remaining pair of Red and Background squares to make a total of 4 Half Square Triangles. Press to Red. Trim to 2 1/2".
- 6. Following the diagram at right, assemble a Gold/Background HST and a Green/ Background HST to make a unit. Make 4.
- 7. Next stitch a Red/White HST to a Red/Background HST, following diagram, to make a unit. Make 4.
- 8. Now stitch a Step 6 Unit to a Step 7 unit, matching the orientation to the diagram at right. Make 4.
- 9. Assemble the 4 Step 8 units, 2 at a time, so a Red/White Pinwheel appears in the center, always watching orientation. Block should measure 8 1/2".





















Cutting:

Background: 2 7/8" Squares 2 ea. Green: 2 7/8" Squares: Cut on One Diagonal Only 2 ea. 3 1/4" Square: Cut on Both Diagonals White: 1 ea. 2 1/2" Square Red: 1 ea. 2 7/8" Squares 2 ea. 5 1/4" Square: 1 ea. 2 7/8" Squares Gold: 4 ea

Block Assembly:

- 1. Add a White Triangle to opposite sides of the 2 1/2" Red Square, centered. Repeat with remaining White Triangles for the last two sides of the Red Square to make a Square in A Square.
- 2. Add Green Triangles to the Step One Unit, in a similar manner. Trim to 4 1/2", keeping points true.
- 3. Make 4 Flying Geese Units following instructions on next page with the Red 5 1/4" Square (Geese) and Gold 2 7/8" Squares (Sky). Completed Geese units should measure 2 1/2" X 4 1/2"
- 4. Mark one diagonal on the Background Squares. Layer a Background Square RST with a Red 2 7/8" square. Stitch on both sides of the marked diagonal. Cut on the diagonal. Open and trim to 2 1/2". Make 4.
- 5. Add Flying Geese units to opposite sides of the Square In A Square Step 2 units. (Center Row)
- 6. Watching orientation, add Half Square Step 4 units to opposite sides of remaining Flying Geese units. Make two. (Top and Bottom Rows)
- 7. Stitch rows together to complete the block, watching orientation. Block should measure 8 1/2" raw/unfinished.



LynBrown.com Presents Spiffy 4 At Once Method for Flying Geese

You need two fabrics, a Goose fabric (single big triangle) and a Sky fabric (pair of smaller triangles). A Flying Geese Unit is twice as wide as it is long. For this method, you cut Sky squares 7/8" larger than the finished Flying Geese unit is long (4 ea. For 4 geese) and Goose squares 1 1/4" larger than the finished width (only 1 ea. for 4 geese).

Example: For Geese blocks that finish 2" X 4", cut 4 ea. Sky squares 2 7/8" and one Goose fabric square 5 1/4".


To make 4 Geese:


- 1.Finger press or draw one diagonal crease in each of your smaller (Sky) squares.
- 2.Lay two smaller (Sky) squares right sides together (RST) to the larger square so the smaller squares align with opposite corners of the larger (Goose) square as at right. Be sure diagonal creases line up as shown.
- 3. Stitch 1/4" on both sides of those creases. Cut on the diagonal. Now you have two odd looking sections (shown). Press to the Sky Triangles.
- 4. On each section, lay another Sky square RST in the corner of each Goose as shown.
- 5. Stitch on both sides of marked diagonal. Cut on the diagonal.
- 6. Press to the Sky triangles and you have four Flying Geese units. Trim if necessary.





2. Layer Background B and Gold B. Stitch on both sides of the drawn diagonal. Cut on line. Open and press to dark. Trim to 2 1/2". Make 4. 3. Stitch a Step 1 unit to a Step 2 unit, watching orientation. Make 4.

4. Stitch a White E to opposite sides of a Red E. Stitch Red C, centered, on opposite sides of the Unit as shown. Press to Red.

5. Stitch a Red D to opposite sides of a White E, aligning the straight edge as shown. Stitch Red C, centered, at the top of the unit as show. Press to Red. Make 2.


6. Add a Step 5 unit to opposite sides of Step 4 unit as shown. Unit should measure 4 1/2". Press away from center.

- 7. Watching orientation, add Half Square Step 3 units to opposite sides of the Step 6 unit. Press to Center.
- 8. Add Red A squares to opposite sides of remaining Half Square Step 3 units. Make two. (Top and Bottom Rows) Press to Red.
- 9. Stitch rows together to complete the block, watching orientation. Block should measure 8 1/2" raw/unfinished.

- Make 4 Flying Geese Units by centering the long sides of the small triangles on the short sides of the large triangles using the Red 5 1/4" Triangles (Geese) and 2 Gold and 2 White 2 7/8" Triangles (Sky) following Diagram B for placement. Completed Geese units should measure 2 1/2" X 4 1/2".
- 3. Stitch a Step 1 Geese Unit to a Step 2 Geese Unit following Diagram C. Make 4. Watch Orientation.
- 4. Stitch the Step 3 units first into pairs then into the Christmas Goose block. Block should measure 8 1/2" raw.











3. Stitch a Gold and a Green triangle together along a short edge, matching orientation shown at right. Make four.

4. Stitch a Step 2 unit to a Step 3 unit along the long edge as shown at right. Unit should measure 4 1/2". Make four.

5. Stitch two Step 4 units together as shown. Make two.

6. Stitch the two Step 5 units together to complete the block. Block should measure 8 1/2".



Block Assembly:

- 1. Stitch a Red and a White As together along their long edge. Make four units that measure 2 1/2".
- Stitch Step 1 units into pairs as shown at right watching orientation. Make 2. Stitch these into a 4 1/2" Pinwheel as shown. Press last seam open.
- 3. Sew a Gold and a Green B together along short edge, watching orientation as at right. Make 4. Add these units to the top and bottom of the Pinwheel. Add the remaining units to the sides of the Pinwheel.
- 4. Sew a Gold and Background Bs along short edge, watching orientation as at right. Add these units to opposite sides of the block ass shown. Complete the Block by adding the final Gold/Background units to the remaining sides. Block should measure 8 1/2".







Setting Your "Do Your See" Quilt With Sashing and Cornerstones Cutting:

White

Red, Gold and Green:

110 ea. 63 TOTAL 1 1/2" X 8 1/2"strips 1 1/2" squares

Assembly:

1. Press blocks well. Square all blocks to 8 1/2".

2. Layout your blocks into a pleasing arrangement. There are eight pieced blocks. Try placing one pieced block in each row. Find a layout that

pleases your eye. Mark your blocks for placement.

3. Add sashing strips to the left side of all your blocks. Press toward the sashing strip.

4. Stitch cornerstone to left side of the rest of your sashing strips. Press toward the sashing strip. Make 62.

5. Stitch cornerstone/sashing strip set to bottom of each block. Press toward Cornerstone/sashing strip. Make 48.

6. Add a sashing/cornerstone strip to the top

of each of your 6 Top Row blocks.

7. Stitch your top row together. Add an additional

cornerstone to one sashing/

cornerstone strip and add it to the to the

right side of the first row.

8. Stitch the rest of the sashed

blocks into rows. Add

sashing/cornerstone to the

right side of the rows.

15. Stitch the rows together to form your quilt center.






Fold the Top and Bottom Borders in thirds. Center those words on the thirds marks. Fold the Side Border to find the center. Fold again to find the quarter mark. Center those words on those marks. Applique

your favorite way. Add the side borders first, then add the Top and Bottom Borders to complete the quilt. Quilt as Desired. Bind with 8 ea. 2 1/2" X Width Of Fabric
