Background, Batting and Backing 11 1/2" x 19 1/2". 2 Pillow Backs 10 1/2" x 20 1/2" Prep for Fusible Appliqué: Letter Templates (this page and next)

Pillow Cover Assembly:

1. Crease the Background in half both lengthwise and crosswise. Layout your letters centered on the Background using the creases as a guide. Fuse in place. These will be stitched down with intense guilting. 2. Layer Background, Batting and Backing. Quilt as desired. I quilted lines randomly spaced about 1/4" apart. Trim to 10 1/2" x 18 1/2". 3. Fold the Pillow Backs wrong sides together crosswise (to $10 \ 1/2$ " x 10 1/4"). Layer atop the Right Side of your quilted piece, aligning raw edges with the folds overlapping at the center. Stitch all around, trim corners and turn through the opening created by the folds.

Inner Pillow:

3/8 yard of muslin or other scrap fabric Stuffing (I like PolyFil 100% Premium Polyester Fiberfill)

Cut:


2 ea. 10 1/2" x 18 1/2"

Assembly:

1. Place the two fabrics right sides together. Stitch around, leaving an opening to turn.

2. Turn and press. Stuff. Hand stitch opening close.
